- Encourage your child to show friendship and respect for others and to abide by the school behaviour policy, ensuring a safe, caring environment for all
- Keep you informed about your child's progress and behaviour, as well as the learning they will undertake
- Set regular homework projects that link to what is being taught in school
- Make you feel welcome whenever you visit the school and respond to your questions or concerns as quickly as possible
- Support the PTA wherever possible.

### **The Role of the Parent/Carer:**

- Having chosen Khalsa Primary School for your child, accept the school's aims and Sikh values, positively supporting the school
- Support your child in being ready to learn each day with the correct uniform, PE kit and any other equipment that is required during the day. This should be sent to school in a Khalsa Primary School book bag.
- Ensure that your child attends school punctually every day during term time, unless there is a good reason for absence (e.g. illness)
- Notify the school by email, letter or telephone in the event of absence
- Support the school's policies and guidelines on learning, behaviour and uniform, both in School and at home
- Attend parent/teacher meetings to discuss your child's progress
- Support your child with homework that is set, including reading and regularly commenting in the reading record
- Support your child in completing imposition if they are set it by the class teacher
- Keep us informed of where to contact you in case of emergency
- Promptly inform the school of any concerns or problems that may affect your child's learning, behaviour or happiness at school
- Support the PTA in fundraising activities where possible.
