Following the Sikh principle of Vandh Shakna (sharing with others) the children actively participate in community work and raising money for local and national charities through sponsored activities.

## The Spiritual Environment

The Sri Guru Granth Sahib Ji (religious scriptures) provides education that teaches children the simplicity of life, **purity** of the heart and **harmony** with nature.

Pupils start each day with prayers for all humanity in accordance with the Akal Takhat (supreme authority) code of conduct. An atmosphere of spiritual peace reflects from within the four walls of the Gurdarbar (spiritual hall) into the whole of the school.

They learn to be confident, self assured young people who have strong principles, which allows them to live happy and productive lives. Children will leave Khalsa Primary with a deeper understanding of their faith which will help them to fulfil their academic capabilities and individual ambitions.





### At the Heart of f the Community

The continuing **success** of our school is due to the tremendous **support** of the local and wider **community**.

The school Gurdarbar is open at weekends to allow our pupils, parents and other community members to come together. They can enjoy seeing the children performing keertan (religious hymns) and partake with families holding Sukhmani Sahib Ji (prayers) on special occasions.

Over 300 children currently attend the Sunday Panjabi School where they are taught written and spoken Panjabi as well as Sikh studies. The school trustees also organise an annual week-long summer camp as well as celebrating Gurpurbs (religious days and anniversaries of the Sikh calendar). A great strength of the school is the wide range of after school clubs, which are popular and well attended.

#### **Balancing the Curriculun**

The school provides a well **balanced** curriculum that meets the needs and **interests** of all pupils.

The National Curriculum is taught across the school with Panjabi, Sikh studies and community work carefully woven into the timetable for each class. The children have the opportunity to learn French in Key Stage 2. A variety of educational visits stimulate and consolidate the children's learning contributing to their enjoyment.

We offer a selection of sporting, artistic and academic clubs each term. Many of these clubs are run on a voluntary basis, however more specialist sporting activities are run by external organisations.
