### PAINTING AND HYGIENE IN NURSERY





Nursery learnt about personal hygiene and how to look after their teeth and the importance of washing our hands, covering our mouth when we cough, having a regular bath or shower and brushing our teeth. As a class, we have been talking about what our teeth do and why we need to keep them healthy. Children have been using a model set of teeth to practise how to brush their teeth correctly. To encourage children to brush every day, we have a brushing chart that they do everyday in class.

### Reception

In Reception, we have been learning about Monsters. We started off by reading an adjective packed story 'The Gruffalo'. It was so much fun learning it through a story map. We used actions and different voices for the characters and made our own changes to the story. This is a fun and interesting way to learn and write as children find it easier once the story has been internalised. Being at Black Park with our trip, helped us make connections to our topic 'Monsters'. For example, we could see 'log pile houses', the lake, and 'tree top houses' as in the Gruffalo story. We even spotted fossils, such as 'dinosaur footprints' and 'dinosaur poo!'.

### We loved it!





World Book Day 2023 was celebrated at KPS, the year 6's and the teachers thoroughly enjoyed dressing up as their favourite characters and making revolting sandwiches based on Roald Dahl's Revolting cookery book.



We were very lucky to have the opportunity to visit Wexham Secondary School this term and learn more about how science is led in KS3 using hands on experiments. We experimented with how different chemicals react with water for example magnesium, potassium and discussed about different elements in the periodic table; using electrical components we were able to create series circuit and learnt about buzzers and motors; finally, we worked on understanding how our nerves use signal for reaction time when our eyes are closed!




