Nursery

This term in Nursey we have been focusing on children to recognise numbers up to 10. Through different activities and games, our children have been learning to recognise and match numbers together. The children have been recognising numbers within their environment and are able to pronounce them in the correct way. Some of our children are beginning to recognise numbers over 10! Our Nursery children are beginning to recognise two-digit numbers and are able to tell which number comes first. Well done Nursery!





This term in Nursery we have also been looking at different farm animals as part of our story of what the lady bird heard. We looked at where farm animals live and what they eat. Children painted and drew some fantastic farm animals in their habitat and spoke about all the different animals.



The children in Nursery have also been looking at the topic of farm animals. We have been reading what the ladybird heard. They have loved playing in the small world area. The children enjoyed talking about the different parts of the story and using the puppets to retell the story from beginning to end. Our children were able to discuss and explain what would happen next in the story by using full sentences whilst talking. The Nursery children are able to order the story through pictures. Year 3

ETON MUSEUM TRIP

Year 3 have travelled back in time thousands of years ago to the banks of the Nile and have learnt all about the amazing people and places of Ancient Egypt. We learnt about many different Egyptian Gods and Goddesses including Ra, Osiris and Seth. For our school trip, we visited the Eton Museum of Antiquities and had the opportunity to see a range of different Egyptian artefacts, collection of paintings, sculptures and even a life-sized cartouche!





Year 3 was very excited to take part in Sports Day! We worked together as a team to complete many different relays and we showed sportsmanship by cheering each other on! Who know we have so many athletes in our year group – the skill, effort and teamwork was out of this world! 
