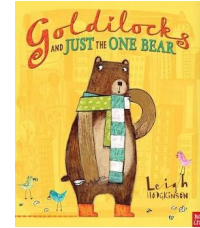
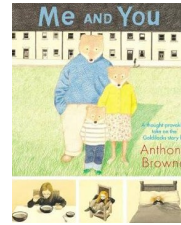
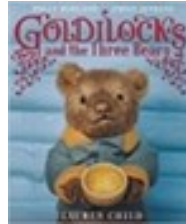


English:

- Sequel



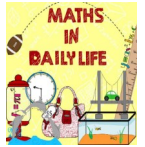
Spelling Focus/Rules

- Common exception words
- -e and -es for plural nouns
- Adding -es to nouns and verbs ending in -y
- Words ending in -tion

Maths:

Children will be learning to add and subtract. Within this, they will be exploring:

- Bonds to 10
- Addition and subtraction bonds within 20
- Bonds to 100 (tens)
- Add three 1-digit numbers
- Subtract from a 10
- Adding 2-digit numbers
- Subtract a 1-digit number from a 2-digit number
- Missing number problems



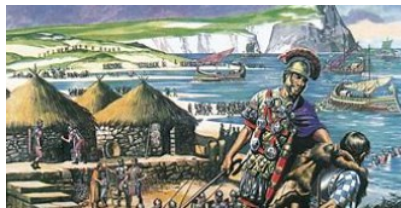
Children will learn about 2-d and 3-d shapes where they will look at:

- Sides and vertices on 2-d shapes
- Faces, vertices and edges on 3-d shapes
- Lines of symmetry on shapes

History

Within 'How did the Romans change Britain over time?' children will gain an early understanding of the Roman Empire, in the familiar context of Britain.

This will be the first opportunity for children to learn about the substantive concept of 'Empire'.



Art

Children will focus on Sculpture (Clay) and create their own Roman House. They will study famous Artist Ranti Bam.

Creating their sculpture children will be able to:

- Flatten and smooth clay
- Make a range of marks within their clay
- Roll a smooth tile surface
- Join clay shapes
- Draw a house design
- Create a clay house



Science:

Within 'What lives in this habitat?' children will learn to:

- Identify differences between living and dead
- Identify a variety of plants and animals in a microhabitat
- Design a suitable microhabitat
- Find out what animals eat to survive in their habitats
- Understand a food chain
- Understand a foods journey from the farm to the supermarket.

PSHE:

Through the Unit 'Celebrating Difference' children will take part in various activities and discussions covering the following learning:

- Assumptions and Stereotypes
- Standing up for self and others
- Making new friends
- Gender Diversity
- Celebrating difference and remaining friends



Music:

Within Music, children will be learning to:

- Use their voices expressively and creatively.
- Sing songs for a nativity.
- Play untuned percussion to a steady beat.



PE: Following our exciting new scheme, children will now develop their PE Skills across 2 units.

Gymnastics

- Perform gymnastics shapes and link together.
- Use shapes to create balances.
- Develop travelling balances across apparatus.
- Create a sequence using apparatus.

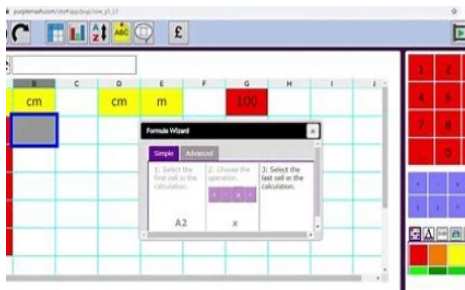
Target Games

Remember, children can log onto Purple Mash at home to get more familiar with the programme.



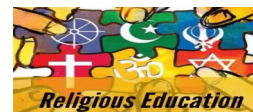
Sikh Studies
