

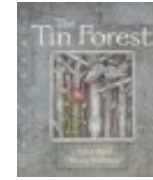
English:

During this term we will be focussing on two different stories within our English theme of 'Dreams and Curiosity' Children will be exploring the stories 'BFG' and 'The Tin Forest' We will use the knowledge learnt from these books to support us in creating meaningful pieces of writing including:

- Own Fantasy Narratives
- Persuasive Information Leaflets

Spelling Focus/Rules

- Common exception words
- Prefixes (dis-, mis-, in-, il-, -im-, -ir-, -re- sub-, inter-, super, anti-, auto-)
- The suffix -ous

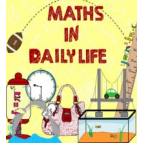


Maths:

Children will be learning further developing their skills for addition and subtraction where they will apply these skills to problem solving.

They will then move onto multiplication and division in which they learn:

- Multiplying using arrays and equal groups
- Sharing and grouping
- Multiples of 2, 5 and 10
- Multiplying and dividing by 3, 4 and 8



History

Within 'What are the changes in Britain from the Stone Age to the Iron Age?' children will build on their knowledge from Year 1 and their understanding of pre-history.

This unit will help children to understand the History of Britain, as a coherent, chronological narrative, starting from the earliest times.



Art

Children will focus on Paintings and create their own Cave Paintings.

Creating their paintings children will be able to:

- Recognise the processes in creating prehistoric art
- Use charcoal to recreate the style of cave artists
- Discuss differences between modern and prehistoric painting
- Make handprints in a range of colours
- Apply knowledge of colour mixing to make natural colours.



Science:

Within 'Why is it important to stay fit and healthy?' children will:

- Explore the 5 key food groups.
- Learn about the nutrition in the food we eat.
- Learn about the different types of skeletons.
- Learn about the human skeleton.
- Learn about animals and their skeletons.
- Explore the role of muscles.

PSHE:

Through the Unit 'Celebrating Difference' children will take part in various activities and discussions covering the following learning:

- Families and their differences
- Family conflict
- Bullying and how to solve it
- Recognise how words can be hurtful
- Giving and receiving compliments



Music:

Within Music, children will be learning to:

- Play simple rhythms using phrases from the stone age.
- Write and read simple notation.
- Ta Tete Tikatika and shh and add to songs on untuned percussion.



PE: Following our exciting new scheme, children will now develop their PE Skills across 2 units.

Gymnastics

- Create and perform point and patch balances.
- Shape jumps using apparatus.
- Develop straight, barrel and forward rolls.
- To create and partner sequence.

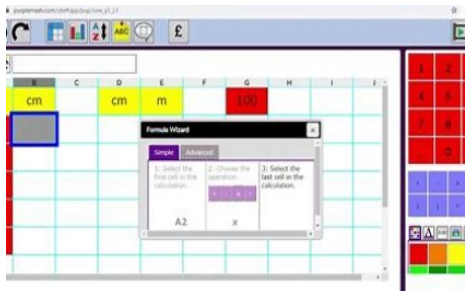
Target Games

Remember, children can log onto Purple Mash at home to get more familiar with the programme.



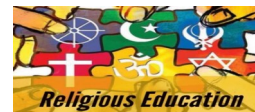
Sikh Studies
