In Guided reading, children will be reading Politics

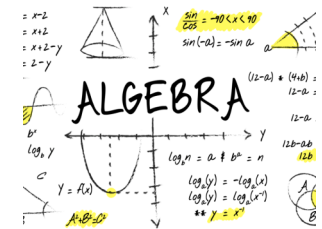
for Beginners Louie Stowell and using different skills to fully understand the text.

**Maths:**

Children will focus on Ratio, decimals and Algebra.

Children will learn to :

- Understand and use the ratio symbol
- Use ratio and fractions
- Find scale factors
- Understand function machines using Algebra
- Solving 1 and 2-step equations in algebra



**Geography**

For this topic, children will be exploring the question:

Why is fair trade fair?



This enquiry enables pupils to understand what international trade entails – the manufacture, selling and buying of goods and services between countries through exports and imports – and the fact that trade has been operating for thousands of years..

**Design & technology**



Children will focus on Textiles. They will look at the work of Stella McCartney/Thomas Burberry

Within this topic children will:

- Design and create a waistcoat (could be for Hugo).
- Follow a pattern piece – mark and cut fabric.
- Decorate with appliqué, beads, buttons or decorative embroidery stitching.

**Science:**

Within the topic 'How does the heart pump blood around the body?' children will :

- Understand the function of the heart and its role in the circulatory system.
- Identify and compare blood vessels.
- Explore blood.
- Learn how the body transports water and nutrients.
- Investigate what affects your heart rate.
- Learn about the impact of drugs and alcohol on the body.

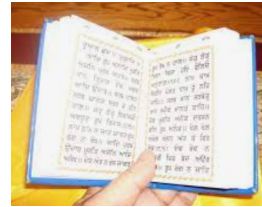
