## KHALSA PRIMARY SCHOOL: PANJABI OVERVIEW INTENT

At Khalsa Primary School, Punjabi is taught as a vital link to our Sikh faith, cultural heritage, and the three pillars of Sikhism: Naam Japna (spiritual reflection and remembrance of God), Kirat Karna (honest earning through hard work), and Vand Chakna (sharing with others and supporting the community). We believe that learning Punjabi enables our pupils to engage meaningfully with Gurbani, participate in acts of worship, and deepen their understanding of Sikh teachings and traditions.

Our well-structured and inclusive curriculum enables pupils to develop their skills in speaking, reading, and writing Punjabi with growing fluency, using Gurmukhi script and a broad vocabulary. It is carefully sequenced to support all learners, regardless of background or starting point, ensuring progression in language acquisition and confidence in communication.

The teaching of Punjabi also promotes cultural pride, intergenerational communication, and a deeper connection to one's identity.

In line with our school vision, we aim to nurture morally grounded, spiritually aware, and culturally literate individuals who embody Sikh virtues and contribute positively to their community and the wider world as exemplary citizens.

#### **Enrichment Opportunities in Panjabi**

#### **Punjabi Drama Club**

At Khalsa Primary School, we offer a Punjabi Drama Club to enhance pupils' speaking and listening skills through performance and creative expression. Pupils rehearse dialogues, explore cultural stories, and build confidence using the Punjabi language. Each term culminates in a grand performance where pupils present their work to parents and the wider school community.

#### **Open Days, Events, and Assemblies**

Pupils are given regular opportunities to use Punjabi during Open Days, where they welcome guests, act as guides, and speak about their learning with pride. During whole school events and assemblies, children confidently present in both English and Punjabi, sharing key messages, reciting Gurbani, and celebrating Sikh festivals and values.

### **Special Assemblies**

In special assemblies, pupils demonstrate their knowledge and understanding of significant Sikh, religious, and cultural events using both English and Punjabi. These bilingual presentations strengthen pupils' confidence, deepen cultural awareness, and promote pride in their linguistic and spiritual heritage.
