PE and Sport Premium - Evaluation and Proposals

Introduction

At Khalsa Primary School, we believe every child deserves the chance to live a healthy, active, and fulfilling life. Giving pupils positive and enjoyable experiences of sport and physical activity from a young age helps develop physical literacy and builds lifelong healthy habits. Regular physical activity supports not only children's physical development but also strengthens their mental wellbeing, boosting self-esteem, reducing anxiety and promoting emotional balance. Active children are typically happier, more resilient, and form trusting, positive relationships with their peers, reflecting our values of **Kindness**, **Love**, and **Honesty**. By ensuring pupils engage in meaningful daily physical activity, we also support improved behaviour, greater focus, and stronger academic outcomes, aligning with our values of **Achievement**, **Aspiration**, and **Service** to oneself and the school community.

Evaluation of PE and Sport Premium in 2024 - 2025

The PE and Sport Premium Funding in 2024 – 2025 was £19,900.

The KPS Pupil Parliament reported that pupils wanted to learn to play more outdoor games at break and lunchtimes. As a result, the wellbeing play area and lunchtime sports active-play provision continued.

As a result, pupils continue to receive consistent, high-quality PE lessons, and the school maintains a strong physical activity offer regardless of staffing changes.

Year 6 Swimming Outcomes 2024 - 2025

All Year 5 and Year 6 KPS pupils participated in swimming lessons throughout 2024-25. Pupils had widely varied levels of prior swimming experience with many pupils swimming for their first-time during school swimming lessons. Pupils were divided into small groups based on their swimming ability and learned a variety of swimming techniques and strokes such as front crawl and backstroke. Pupils also learned and practised various water-based self-rescue skills to keep them safe when swimming in open water such as the sea or a lake. The Year 5 and Year 6 swimming programme was supervised by KPS teachers and taught by specialist swimming instructors at Slough Swimming Centre.

The programme of study for PE sets out the expectation that pupils should be taught to:

- Swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres
- Use a range of strokes effectively (e.g. front crawl, backstroke, breaststroke)
- Perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations

For the 2024-25 academic year, the Year 6 swimming outcomes are as follows:

Super Star Sports provided active lunch time coaching sessions: 1 qualified sports coach provided coaching to pupils in Year 3, 4, 5 and 6.	£8,550	The impact of the Super Star Sports lunchtime coaching will be evidenced through attendance registers, behaviour logs, pupil voice surveys, and observation notes from staff monitoring the sessions. Photographs and short videos can also capture engagement and skill development. Progress will be measured by tracking improvements in pupils' participation, teamwork, behaviour during lunchtimes, and confidence in physical activity. SLT and the PE lead will monitor the sessions half-termly to ensure consistency, quality of delivery, and alignment with school values and PE curriculum aims.

Internal equipment and resources to promote PE, sport and physical activity across the school. This includes wrestling mats for our bespoke wrestling curriculum.	£6,098	The impact of investing in internal equipment and resources, including mats for the wrestling curriculum, will be evidenced through lesson observations, pupil engagement levels, and increased participation in PE and physical activity across year groups. Equipment audits and usage logs will show how frequently and effectively resources are being used. Pupil voice and teacher feedback will highlight improvements in confidence, skill development, and lesson quality. Progress will be monitored termly by the PE lead and SLT to ensure equipment is supporting curriculum delivery, enhancing

Progress will be monitored through tracking improvements in participation, social skills, teamwork and overall engagement in school life. The PE lead and SLT will review uptake and outcomes each half term to ensure the clubs are meeting the needs of targeted groups and reducing barriers to physical activity.

Monitoring will include reviewing competition outcomes, tracking the number of pupils involved (including PP, SEND and vulnerable groups), and assessing how CPD has strengthened curriculum delivery. The PE lead and SLT will evaluate the subscription termly to ensure it is enhancing opportunity, raising the profile of sport, and contributing to

Swimming Targets 2025 - 2026

In 2025 – 2026, Year 5 pupils will participate in swimming lessons. Each pupil will be assessed on their ability to swim competently, confidently, and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres using a range of strokes effectively (e.g. front crawl, backstroke and breaststroke) as well as their ability to perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations. Pupils will be taught and assessed using Swim England's Learn to Swim Framework by specialist swimming instructors at Slough Swimming Centre under the supervision of KPS teachers.
